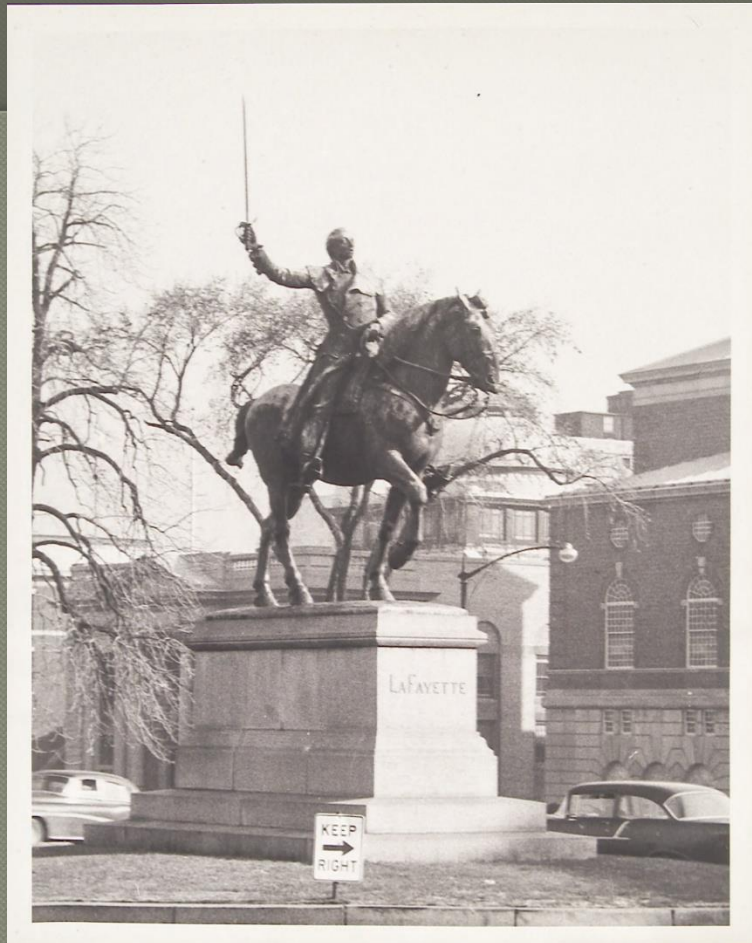
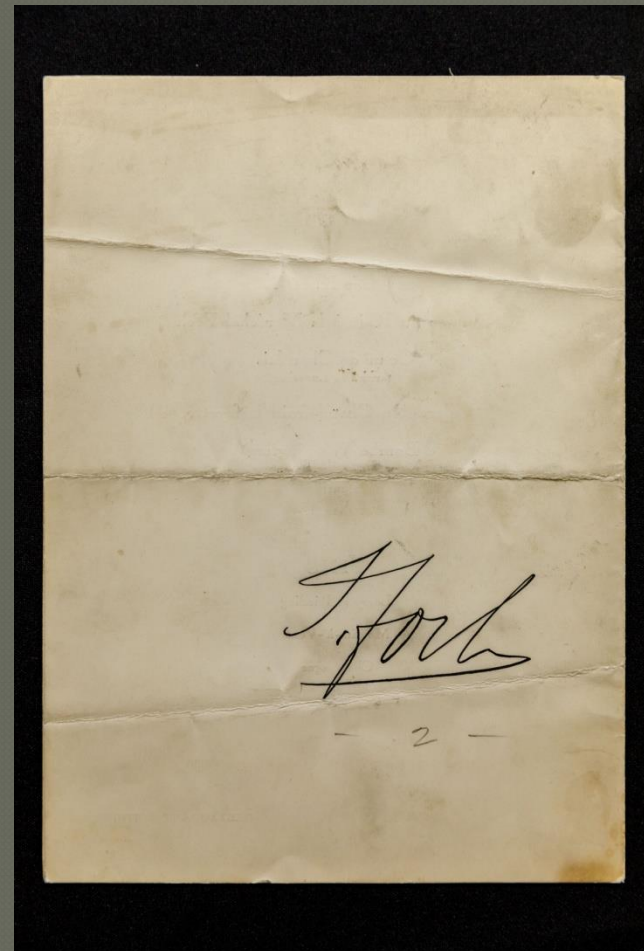
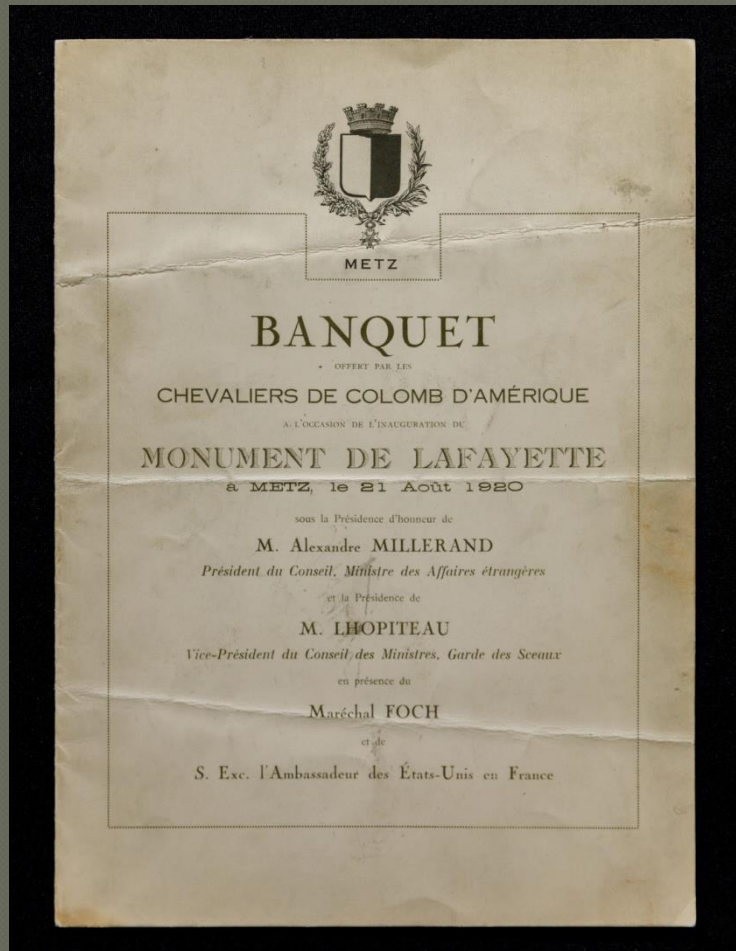

SUPERB FIGURE OF LAFAYETTE BY THE AMERICAN SCULPTOR, PAUL BARTLETT, A GIFT OF THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS TO THE CITY OF METZ, FRANCE. IT WAS UNVEILED WITH IMPOSING CEREMONIES AUGUST 21, 1920. MARSHAL FOCH RECEIVED THE GIFT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AND MADE AN ADDRESS.

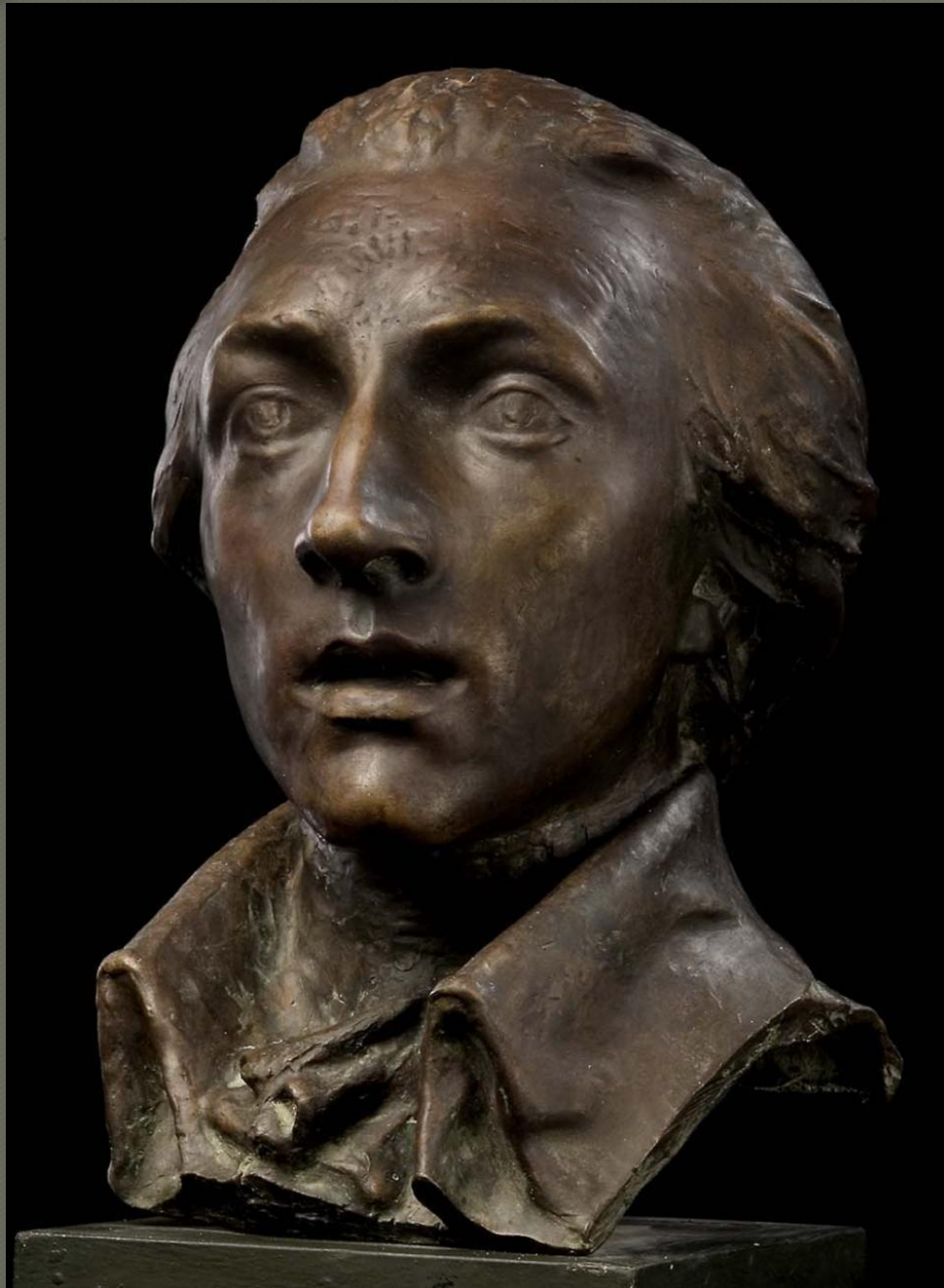
